Civil Ex Parte Hearing Information

General:

The hearing will be set the day following the filing your ex parte paperwork. All ex parte applications are to comply with CRC rule 3.1200 et. seq. (and in particular, rules 3.1203 and 3.1204). An optional form (Declaration Regarding Notice of Ex Parte Application) may be found on the court's website under the link for Fees & Forms.

The court may review the ex parte request in chambers prior the hearing. If the court determines that the moving party has not established good cause for ex parte relief and denies the ex parte request, the courtroom assistant will notify the moving party that their request was denied and the hearing will not proceed. The moving party is required to notify the opposing party of the denial and that the hearing has been taken off calendar.

Each department may have specific days and times for hearing ex-partes. For more information please see the [trial rules](#) for each department.

Western Riverside:

Civil

Requests for ex parte relief can be filed at the ex parte counter in the clerk's office (located at the Attorney Services Counter) or online through the court's website. All ex parte hearings will be set in the department assigned for all purposes.

Moreno Valley Unlawful Detainers

All Ex Parte Applications for unlawful detainer cases for the Moreno Valley jurisdiction shall be filed at the counter and received by the court no later than 11:00 am the day of the hearing in order to be heard the same day.

Eastern Riverside:

Requests for ex parte relief should be filed in the civil clerk's office or online through the court's website. Ex parte hearings will be set in the department assigned for all purposes.
